# Six Weeks Into His New Position as Publisher of The Daily Press

Steve Hunt introduced Donnie Welch, former business owner with more than 25 years experience in the newspaper industry, who was recently named the new publisher of the Daily Press. He worked in Honolulu for four years, improving their marketing strategies and readership. He then went to Burlington, Vermont, where he worked for a little over a year. An opportunity arose in Southern Utah, and he was happy to return home as Publisher of Spectrum Media for a bit, before moving to Southern California. He has seen many changes since his days in the sales department, where "cut and paste" had a more literal meaning than today's digital cutting and pasting.

Donnie explained many of the aspects of readership, which, he states, is higher than it has ever been. Readers have gravitated to other platforms, and the digital offerings of major newspapers throughout the country is exploding. A large percentage of today's readers utilize their Ipads, mobile phones, tablets, desktop computer, etc. as their platform to read the Daily Press, particularly the 18-24 age group. However, Donnie states, "millions more take the Sunday paper every week than watch the Superbowl!" Business knows how powerful this medium is, and they know where to put their advertising dollars.



Donnie has a passion for community newspapers, and is very supportive of working with city leaders to discuss the issues we face in the Victor Valley. In the works is an Editorial Board, made up of community members and Daily Press staff, and Donnie is hopeful that this Board can make an impact on key issues facing our communities; home-
