Christmastime Is Not the Only Season for Fraud...

Rotarians David North of DCB and Teressa DeAtley of Citizen's Business Bank teamed up this week to educate the Rotary Club of Victorville on fraud prevention. As David states, "Tis the season to get ripped off"... although it happens on a daily basis. Embezzelment within organizations, counterfeit money, and fraudulent activity within accounts are major problems today. We had the opportunity to touch some counterfeit bills, and it's not easy to tell the real from the not real! The devices used to rip us off are astounding! David showed us how to check our ATM machine for an "ATM Skimmer". Teressa brought some information on current scams, and lists the following as some important tips to prevent scams:

- ✓ Do not respond to unsolicited (spam) e-mail
- ✓ Do not click on links contained within unsolicited e-mail
- ✓ Only open attachments from known senders
- ✓ Avoid providing personal information in e-mail messages
- ✓ Compare the link in e-mails to the web address link
- ✓ Log on directly to official web sites instead of "linking"
- ✓ Know your customers!

Remember, if it looks too good to be true, it probably is!
