Finding Indian Petroglyphs are a favorite hobby in Sid's exploring as well. At Blackrock Well there are tons of Indian Petroglyphs and miners signatures on the rocks. At Howe Tank near Lucerne Valley, Sid found old Indian sleeping circles and at Hunter Mountain he located a perfectly preserved Arrastra, a primitive mill for grinding and pulverizing gold or silver ore, which was pulled by a donkey.

There is so much beauty in the Mojave Desert. Sid encourages everyone to go on their own journey and explore, you never know what treasures await you.
