World Polio Day



Rotary members and supporters took action on World Polio Day, October 24th, to raise awareness and funds toward eradicating polio. More than 4,200 Rotary, Rotaract, and Interact clubs in 118 countries participated in World Polio Day.

Donors contributed more than US\$740,000 online, which meant a total — with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation's 2-to-1 match of more than \$2.2 million raised.

Social media efforts tied to World Polio Day reached 31 million people, compared to 17 million in 2021.

Rotary International and the World Health Organization hosted the World Polio Day 2022 and Beyond conference that focused on a healthier future for mothers and children. At the event, held October 21-22 in Geneva, Switzerland, WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, RI President Jennifer Jones, and health experts discussed the status of polio eradication and the potential of community-based solutions to improve global health.

Participants heard inspiring keynote speeches, explored case studies, and engaged in discussions with experts about maternal and child health. The conference was recorded, so you can still learn from it about the future of polio eradication and community health.
