did a presentation at the

Hollywood", where
he told stories of being

the youngest son to actress Elinor Donahue (Father Knows Best, Andy Griffith Show) and producer Harry Ackerman (I Love Lucy, Gidget, Bewitched). After an opening film featuring clips of some of his mother's many performances and credits of his father, Chris spoke about his life growing up in Hollywood.

While most people would expect to hear stories of scandals and negativity, these stories focused on humility, honesty and integrity, that were taught to Chris by his parents' actions and situations, that helped shape him as a 20+ year business professional in the High Desert.

Chris learned from an early age, that what his parents did was just a career to them and they never used their fame and popularity to put themselves or the family on a higher
