Rob concluded by sharing that the High-Speed Rail stop will be a game changer for the future of the whole High Desert.



**Brad Poiriez** is the Executive Director of the Mojave Desert Air Quality Management District and always has his eye on the 15 Fwy. This is because a majority of air quality is due to the amount of traffic coming up and down the Pass. Along with

studying the impact of the traffic and what gets transported, the MDAQMD is also big on the legislative side at our State Capital for continued funding to make our air healthier and cleaner. Brad gave a shout out to Victor Valley Transit who is at the forefront of cleaner air, by switching out and adding electric buses to their fleet. The District covers 200,000 square miles from as far east as Needles, north to Trona and west to the Antelope Valley. Surprisingly, with all of this coverage, the District is still just considered a medium size air district! The great news, Brad concluded, is that our local air quality is constantly improving.
