"The Lisa Project is a unique multi-sensory exhibit experience allowing the visitor to hear, see and experience the reality of the world of child abuse." Guest Speaker Beverly Guido-Deutsch is the Child Abuse Prevention Coordinator for the San Bernardino County Children's Network. Beverly works in the surrounding communities promoting child abuse awareness and prevention, and states that the current rise in statistics for all types of child abuse is alarming. "Child abuse is America's best kept secret." Physical and sexual are not the only forms of child abuse. "Neglect" and "emotional" and "verbal" abuse are prevalent issues also, and abuse affects children of all ages, races, and incomes. Instances of suspected abuse or neglect should be reported to Child Protective Services (CPS) or police.


