San Bernardino Fire Service Incident Command System

San Bernardino County Fire Battalion Chief, Mike Wakoski, explained "Incident Man-



agement" and the need for it in public safety, as well as its advantages in the management of any type of business. In the 1970's, the state of California developed the Incident Command System (ICS), and it has since been adopted

as a standard throughout the U.S. The ICS has been established nationally as the standardized incident organizational structure for the management of all incidents. Incident Management is a process designed to return service to normal as quickly as possible after an incident, in a way that has little to no negative impact. It is based upon identification, prioritization (based upon pre-defined factors), and automatic implementation of each incident.
