UNPRECEDENTED GROWTH AND EXCELLENCE

Dr. Walden. Dan Superintendent/President of Victor Valley College, has transformative become figure in the college's history. His visionary leadership has propelled VVC to be one of the fastest-growing colleges in California and the nation. With a commitment to fostering a culture of care, innovation, and academic excellence, Dr. Walden has made it clear that his tenure will conclude with retirement from VVC in six years, ensuring his legacy remains deeply rooted in the Victor Valley community.



A cornerstone of Dr. Walden's leadership is the implementation of innovative student services. The Connections2Success Call Center, established in 2021, exemplifies this vision. In its first year, the center answered 50,000 calls, providing crucial support to students, parents, and community members. In the 2023-2024 academic year, the call center achieved an impressive 118,087 answered calls, with 90% resolved on the first attempt. Caller satisfaction rose to 85%, a 4% increase from the previous year, thanks to the

dedication of Student Service Specialists who handle tier 1 inquiries.

The Engagement Center has also been pivotal in supporting students. Since its inception, the center has assisted over 17,500 students with services such as class registration, navigating Canvas, troubleshooting records holds, and resolving email issues. This academic year alone, the center has served 921 students, with 2,713 unduplicated students benefiting from its resources.

VVC's academic accomplishments continue to shine under Dr. Walden's leadership. Last year's graduation ceremony attracted over 10,000 attendees, celebrating 900 in-person graduates out of 2,000 eligible students. To support the growing student body, VVC added 20 new full-time faculty members and 112 part-time faculty

Under Dr. Walden's guidance, VVC has experienced remarkable growth and success. The college's enrollment has reached a total of 24,874 students for the 2023-2024 fiscal year, affirming its status as a middle-sized institution with a national reputation for growth. This success is a testament to Dr. Walden's dedication to creating a "five-star experience" for students and staff alike.

members this year, with plans to onboard an additional 16 full-time faculty in the near future.

The college's Educational Event Center, seating 1,000 people, stands as a testament to its commitment to hosting significant academic and community events.

Dr. Walden's efforts have not gone unnoticed. In 2023, he received the prestigious Dr. John W. Rice Award, honoring his commitment to advancing equity and student success.

Victor Valley College has broadened its educational offerings to include non-credit courses and certificates. Currently available programs include Home Economics, Auto Non-Credit, Commercial Driver's License, Emergency Telecommunication Dispatcher, Cosmetology, and Forklift Operation. Future offerings will include Court Reporting, Low Voltage Installation Technician, Notary Public, Pharmacy Technician, Phlebotomy, Real Estate Non-Credit, and Photography, further enhancing opportunities for the community.

Dr. Walden's approach to leadership is grounded in his role as a "Chief Experience Officer." By fostering a supportive campus culture and implementing programs like the Caring Campus Initiative, VVC has seen increased retention and engagement among students and staff.

As Dr. Walden looks ahead to retirement in six years, his focus remains on ensuring Victor Valley College's continued trajectory of growth and excellence. His enduring impact will leave a legacy of opportunity and success for generations to come.
