### **Love Costing Less than Fear and Hostility**

How does a family move from one of the best cities in America to the worst in the world? Hearing from **Gem** 

Munro, founder of the Amarok Society, you soon learn that Gem is a man who truly epitomizes care and humanity to others. A Canadian, Gem has devoted his life improving educational opportunities around the world. The Amarok Society provides educational programs to one of the worst counties in the world, Bangladesh.

Years ago Gem and his wife **Dr. Tanyss Munro** packed their 4 kids and headed to Bangladesh where millions live in terrible slums and are so poor they cannot attend school. In fact only 1 every 3 children, has just some type

of education. The country is massively overpopulated too. Imagine fitting 180 million people in an area 1/4 the size of California and you'll get a pretty good idea.

Gem and his wife decided to teach mothers in the Bangladesh slums to become teachers to neighborhood

children. The response they received in the country, was that it was an innovated idea, but wouldn't work because such

poor women would be unteachable, and on top of that with violent husbands, slumlords and extremists, they'd be lucky to make it out alive!

Five months later they laid the groundwork for their mission. The first lesson they teach the women is how to hold a pencil, secondly, they show them which end of the pencil works with the paper. They teach them Bengali language, literacy, math, health, social studies, conflict resolution and English. In fact, Gem loves teaching them English, because in this country, only the elite know the

English language and they hate it that these poor women know it too.

Once the women are ready, they must agree to teach at least 5 children in the neighborhood from what they have learned from the Society, but most teach a lot more children because not only are the women educated, but it creates a positive community within the slums and teaches them to think! These women's lives have purpose now where they felt their lives were over when they were married off around the age of 11.

For Gem and the Amarok Society the biggest reason why they have dedicated their lives to this service is one simple thing; the more you learn about the world, the more you love the world. Find out more at www.amaroksociety.org.
