

THE BIRTH OF S.A.R.T. OPERATIONS

Providence St. Mary Medical Center in Apple Valley, CA, is proud to announce the upcoming launch of its Sexual Assault Response (S.A.R.T.) Team department, set to open in April 2025. Spearheaded by Katie Berrios, with support from Nicole **Orr**, the S.A.R.T. program will provide



critical services to survivors of sexual assault in the High Desert region.

The need for such services is more pressing than ever. According to national statistics, someone is sexually assaulted every 68 seconds, with 91% of victims being women. In the High Desert cities of Adelanto, Apple Valley, Hesperia, Victorville, and Barstow, 381 sexual assaults were reported between 2019 and 2021—an average of 10 reported victims per month or 120 per year. However, sexual assault remains one of the most

underreported crimes, with estimates suggesting that up to 63% of assaults are never brought to the attention of law enforcement.

The S.A.R.T. program will be staffed by five registered nurses trained to provide compassionate, trauma-informed

care to patients aged 12 and up. Operating 24 hours a day, the department will offer comprehensive services, including forensic exams, suspect exams, follow-up care, phone consultations, and mental health support. Children under 12 will continue to receive care at the Loma Linda Child Advisory Center.

In collaboration with community partners like Partners Against Violence, S.A.R.T. will also provide advocacy services, accompanying patients to meetings and assisting with law enforcement interactions. The team is actively working with local non-profits to train volunteers in identifying individuals who may benefit from S.A.R.T. services.

To create a calming, supportive environment, the S.A.R.T. exam room will be renovated with new flooring, paint, furniture, ceiling tiles, and a forensic camera—designed to feel more like a spa than a hospital room. An exam bed that folds into a chair will further enhance patient comfort.
