2025 EMPLOYMENT LAWS IN CALIFORNIA

This week, the Rotary Club of Victorville welcomed guest speaker **Mike Thrapp**, Operations, Safety, and Risk Officer at ICR Staffing Services, Inc. Mike presented an informative session on the new employment laws set for California in 2025.

One of the key takeaways from his presentation was an update on minimum wage. While the state minimum wage is now \$16.50 per hour, Thrapp noted that some local jurisdictions have higher minimum wage requirements. Additionally, exempt employees must earn at least \$68,640 annually to maintain exempt status. He also shared that the IRS mileage reimbursement rate has increased to 70 cents per mile.

Mike then highlighted several important bills and laws affecting California employers and employees in 2025:

SC1100 - Driver's License Discrimination: Employers are prohibited from requiring a driver's license as a

form of identification unless the job specifically requires driving. However, exceptions exist if not having a driver's license would create a hardship, such as a project manager needing to visit job sites.

SB 1340 - Local Enforcement of Workplace Discrimination Laws: This law strengthens local authorities' ability to enforce workplace discrimination laws, providing more avenues for employees to seek justice.

AB 1850 - Race Discrimination for Hairstyles: This law clarifies terminology related to racebased hair discrimination and ensures that employees cannot

be discriminated against for wearing ethnic hairstyles.

SB 1350 - Cal/OSHA Household Domestic Coverage:

OSHA now has jurisdiction over household domestic jobs, including housekeepers and landscapers. Thrapp dubbed this the "Inviting OSHA to Dinner" law, as it allows OSHA to inspect homes for compliance as if they were traditional workplaces.

AB 2123 - Paid Family Leave Vacation Use: This bill modifies existing paid family leave legislation, impacting how employees can utilize their vacation time when taking family leave.

AB 2499 - Broadened Enforcement Under FEHA:
The Fair Employment and Housing Act (FEHA) now

includes additional provisions, expanding enforcement capabilities under the Civil Rights Department.

SB 399 - Captive Audience Meetings Ban: Employers can no longer mandate attendance at organizational meetings that force employees to engage in religious or political activities, such as prayer or reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. This law protects workers from employer intimidation and retaliation regarding political or religious beliefs.

SB 988 - Freelance Worker Protection Act: This law provides commonsense protections for freelance workers, ensuring they receive fair treatment and timely payment for their work.

Mandatory Postings: Employers must now display required notices for AB 2299 - Whistleblower Protection and AB 1870 - Workers' Compensation Notice to keep employees informed of their rights.

PAGA Reform Updates: While not new for 2025, updates to SB 92 and AB 2288 refine the Private Attorney General Act (PAGA), which allows employees to sue for labor law violations on behalf of the state.
