COUNTY EDUCATION FROM THE INSIDE OUT

McEachron. Ryan elected in 2022 to the San Bernardino Board County Education, recently spoke to the Rotary Club of Victorville about his experience and responsibilities as a board member. Representing Area A, McEachron's district includes school throughout districts the High Desert, as



well as more remote areas like Baker, Needles, and Trona. His role covers a broad and diverse educational landscape, including a school inside the Juvenile Detention Center in Apple Valley—a place where he's had the meaningful experience of attending two student graduations. "It's inspiring to see young lives change right in front of you," he told the Rotary members.

There are 58 County Boards of Education in California, each governing a County Office of Education (COE).

Collectively, they support nearly 1,000 school districts and serve 6.2 million K-12 students. The San Bernardino County Board of Education consists of five members from different professional and personal backgrounds. Together, they aim to represent local values while fostering a shared vision for educational success.

McEachron explained that the Board's responsibilities include adopting COE budgets, overseeing educational programs, and conducting hearings for

student expulsion appeals and charter school petitions. In partnership with County Superintendent **Ted Alejandre**, the Board works to ensure a safe and supportive learning environment for all students.

Transparency and accountability are key elements of their governance. Public hearings are conducted regularly, and the Board evaluates its own performance to ensure ongoing effectiveness. Despite varying political perspectives among members, McEachron emphasized the Board's commitment to open, respectful communication and unity in purpose.

He closed his presentation by stressing the importance of education and community leadership, encouraging others to stay involved and informed. "We're here to serve our communities and help shape the future through education," he said.
