Mike shared with the Club this week the large amount of money that is flowing through the Victor Valley and Barstow, is close to a billion dollars. He has been tracking the local real estate market for over 15 years, keeping a close eye on housing inventory, home sales, and foreclosure data.

Below are some of the millions of dollars flowing through our region:

The Rancho Lucerne Master Planned Community took out a 2.2 million dollar loan in 2022 and is 1,372 total acres and will provide over 25 million in improvements.

In North Apple Valley, 5.1 million is going into homes at Standing Rock and Central. LGI Homes, the first public builder to come back to the High Desert since the great recession of 2008, will begin building homes in the previously abandoned walled and gated community on July 1st.

Across Hesperia, 457 lots

will soon have homes from such builders as Richmond, Lenmar and others.

For the commercial/industrial market, Highway 395 is a hot place currently. The Covington Group recently paid 20.5 million and US Foods spent 10.3 million on the land alone in that area.

SCLA will continue to expand with 269 million in total for buildings and new businesses, and 100 acres of land recently purchased for 13.5 million. The Amazon empire continues to grow in the High Desert with a 1.3 million sq. ft. warehouse coming to SCLA.

Adelanto will also be part of the growth. 1,117 acres for a solar plant was purchased for 12.4 million and Lesso America paid 7.1 million for 132 acres of land to build upon.

Have you seen the beautiful upgrades to the old glass plant on Silica Road? It was purchased for 6.25 million and rumored to be manufacturing bounce houses, while two new industrial parks will be built at the location.

Heading North to Barstow, the **BNSF** Railway will be bringing the Barstow International Gateway Project that will open 20,000 jobs. Using 2-3 mile trains, containers will travel from Long Beach to Barstow, where trucks will then take shipments East and West to their final destinations. The building of this will Project will take up 4,200 acres in Barstow, with a price tag of 1.5 billion!

Finally, Apple Valley will continue to be a

shopping mecca with ground breaking last week on the Sprouts Market, with Raising Canes Chicken opening next door. Across Bear Valley Road will see Five Below, Hobby Lobby and Marshall's.

With all of this expansion, Mike is projecting that our current population of 450,000 will grow to 800,000 in the next decade. For an example, he shared that our current Victor Valley was the way the city of Ontario looked in the 1980's. He predicts our region will be similar to the current day Ontario within the next ten years.
