

June 11, 2024 THE MANY PROGRAMS OF VICTOR VALLEY TRANSIT

While many people see Victor Valley Transit buses in their capacity as a fixed route system, which picks up and drop off passengers at bus stops around the High Desert, or their Direct Access ADA vehicles which take their senior disabled clients to where they need to go, are only seeing a fraction of the bigger picture that makes up Victor Valley Transit. VVTA's CTSA Programs Manager **Ashley**



Palmer came by the Club this week to share some of the programs that many people aren't aware of.

She began by sharing information on the Agency's VanPool program, currently the 10th largest in the United States. A VVTA VanPool is a group of 5 to 15 commuters who travel a minimum of 30 miles round trip together to and from work. Participants share the cost of leasing a luxury vehicle from one of VVTA's approved vendors, such as Commute with Enterprise, Green Commuter or Airport Van Rental. Eligible VanPool's qualify for a subsidy from VVTA, up to \$600 per month to help with leasing costs.

The benefits of a VVTA VanPool is a more relaxed commuter, reduced fuel and maintenance costs, less freeway congestion and a smaller carbon footprint left on the environment.

The next program Ashley shared was their Brokerage Program. Once an Direct Access vehicle is at the end of its useful life at Victor Valley Transit, it used to be retired and sold at auction.

Instead, the Agency brings the vehicle back to "like-new" condition and collaborates with area nonprofits. They donate the vehicle to them on the agreement that they not only use it to benefit their non profit, but transport VVTA's Direct Access passengers at the fixed cost of \$1 per trip instead of the \$3-\$6 fee through VVTA.

Spoken about before at Rotary, Micro-Link, the micro transit service from VVTA has taken off as is now serving the community at capacity. This is an on-demand shared transit service, currently serving riders in two zoned areas, one in southwest Hesperia, and one in the northwest area of Victorville. Rides are \$2 each and come with a free fixed route day pass, for those who want to continue their trip outside the zone area. VVTA recently purchased an additional six Micro-Link vehicles to help with the demand and in the Fall, will open a third zoned area in Apple Valley.

Next, Ashley was very excited to share information on their TRIP (Transportation Reimbursement & Information Program. The TRIP Program is an alternative for seniors



and disabled High Desert residents who do not drive and cannot use traditional public transportation. TRIP passengers recruit drivers from friends, neighbors, and family members who, they know and trust. Trips can include multiple destinations including doctors' appointments, shopping, errands, and more. VVTA's TRIP Program provides mileage reimbursement for fuel that the rider passes along to their driver. VVTA's TRIP Program is a "quality of life" program that helps clients feel empowered to take back control of their transportation needs, and life!

Another program that was discussed was their outreach to the residents of Trona, and Big River, which borders with Parker, Arizona. With no viable transportation options for those unincorporated communities, VVTA has funded their senior and community centers with vehicles to be able to address the transportation needs of the residents of these disadvantaged communities to wherever they need to travel. For many of the residents, this is a much needed lifeline for medical care, banking and shopping.

Victor Valley Transit also offers a one-on-one or group Travel Training Program. Whether someone is new to transit or looking to enhance their riding skills, VVTA's trainers will guide them through bus riding, route planning, and maximizing the VVTA fixed route system. Travel Training can be customized for each riders needs and goals.

Finally, Ashley spoke about their Ambassador Program. For those who love to ride public transportation, Ambassadors help others to feel confident and empowered to ride the bus. Ambassadors show them the ropes, answer questions, and guide them by answering questions about VVTA's every growing transit network. The Ambassador Program is a volunteer position, but Ambassadors ride Victor Valley Transit at no charge, which is a huge benefit.
