WOULD YOU LIKE TODAY TO BE DIFFERENT?

This week the Club heard from **Bill Edwards**, Executive Director of the Rescue Mission Alliance of the Victor Valley. Bill has been involved in ministry for 20 years, and for the last 15 years has run the Rescue Mission Alliance, making difference in the lives of both men and women.

The Alliance is a non profit, faith based organization which seeks to provide "Refuge" by providing food,

clothing and shelter for those in need. Their mission is also "Recovery" by providing biblically based programs that helps the mind, body and spirit and finally "Restoration" equipping people to live productive and independent lives.

This is mainly done through their year long Recovery Program, that costs between \$12,000 - \$13,000 per person. The costs is covered through grants, foundations, private donors and their thrift store in Hesperia.

After they conclude the program, the work of the Alliance doesn't end there. Next they go into their Transition

Program, which teaches them the tools to get back on their feet and live independently. After the 3 years it takes to get a new life started, 80% of the people who have gone through the program after 5 years are still sober, employed and reconciled with loved ones. The percentage of other programs is around 40%.

People who end up on the street need around 50 touch

points to help them develop a relationship where Bill and his team can get them to a point of wanting to change.

One of these touch points include their Shower Truck Program at four locations in the High Desert. In each 3 hour sessions, 50 hot showers are provided and include food, haircut, clothes and hygiene items. This is a great way of building relationships with the homeless community.

Another opportunity is their Emergency Food Pantry, that give away free weekly meals, clothing and hygiene products to struggling families. These giveaways also include pet food and market produce.

An upcoming program will be their Food Truck Program that will be used to start a Culinary Arts program, giving those in their program another way to succeed.

Finally, never underestimate the level of your generosity, no matter how small. Bill has seen firsthand that pair of shoes or even socks can make a difference in someone to change forever!
