MWA'S WATER DELIVERY SYSTEM

The Club heard from Mike Simpson this week, who shared information on how water from the Mojave Water Agency is delivered to our area. Mike serves as the MWA's Director of Engineering and Operations.

The Mojave Water Agency is one of 29 State Water Contractors with access to the State Water Project. The MWA was

created by High Desert voters in 1960 and is governed by a seven member elected Board of Directors. The Agency is responsible for managing the region's water resources to ensure a sustainable supply of water for present and future use.

2023 was a record year for the Mojave Water Agency. In one year alone they delivered and recharged 99,471 acre feet of water. Of that amount, 89,800 came from the State Water Project and the remaining water was supplied naturally from mountain snow and rainfalls.

Due to a such a wet late 2022 and early 2023, the Agency was given 100% allocation of water to use. The allocation amount varies each year. For example, this year, the allocation amount from the State Water Project is 40%, around 40 acre feet.

The State Water Project is a multi-purpose water storage and delivery

system, stretching over 700 miles. It delivers clean water to 27 million Californians, 750,000 acres of farmland and businesses throughout the state.

Water delivered by the project originates primarily in the Sierra Mountains in Northern California and is pumped into the project from the Sacramento-San Joaquin River Delta near Stockton. Some of the water is delivered to water agencies in the Bay Area and along California's central coast, but a majority of the water is delivered to be stored in the San Luis Reservoir. From there, water travels through the California aqueduct down the Central Valley, over the Tehachapi and San Gabriel Mountain ranges, passing through the western Mojave Desert and into Southern California.

The Agency's service area is over 4900 square miles in size, with 170 miles of pipeline. The pipeline size varies in places ranging from 20" to 54" in diameter and is cement mortar lined with thick, coated steel.
