## THE GREAT ESCAPE TO DISCOVER FREEDOM

The Club received a visit this week from Hildy Valenzuela Wendtland, Rotarian with the San Bernardino Sunset Club. Realtor and author. Her memoir. "Barefoot To Freedom," paints a vivid portrait of a life shaped by communism dictatorship and the quest for her personal liberation.

On April 1st, 1980, a bus with hopeful asylees crashed into the Peruvian embassy in Havana, Cuba. Within 48 hours, over

10,800 people occupied every inch of the 28,000-squarefoot embassy. Among them was a fourteen-year-old girl clinging to her younger brother. Relying on the wisdom of her father, Hildy also clung to hope. Hope that would see them through appalling conditions, near starvation, and the unpredictable desperation of those around them.

Hildy shared her story of having to stand in the same place for over 50 days inside the Embassy, knowing if she gave up and left, then her life would be over. In addition, she saw the worst of human behavior rear its ugly head, as the fight for survival took over for many in the Embassy.

In the word's of her dying father, "I will die here, so you can have freedom".

Her strength was further tested by her escape on a small boat, which led her being airlifted onto a Coast Guard ship, clutching onto the gurney of her already dead father.

Much of her story shaped her into her passion for the freedoms of America. She encouraged every attendee

to vote, not matter what side of the political spectrum you fall into. Make sure you have your voice heard at the ballot box.

Hildy's life experiences in Cuba as a child during the Cold War and the cruelties of communism toward nongovernment sympathizers are woven into this tale of survival.

Barefoot to Freedom is a real-life example of the perils of collective thinking and the threat of contemporary socialism. A must-read warning of what happens when

democracy is not defended.

Finally, in the words of Hildy herself, "When the why is bigger than your circumstances, the human spirit is unbreakable".
