SILVERWOOD COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Homes will start at 500k and up with a minimum lot size of 2900 sq. ft. Each home will be equipped with full fiber internet. The plan for Silverwood will include two town centers, country club, plus different architectural home designs featuring Western Regional, Bungalow, Spanish Style, Monterey, Farmhouse and Mission stlyes. These homes will be built by such companies as Lennar and Richmond American.

As of now, the Silverwood community is still in the early stages of development, with initial groundwork and infrastructure projects underway. The developers have set a tentative timeline for completion, with the first phase of homes expected to be ready for occupancy by late 2026. Subsequent phases will be rolled out over the following years, with the entire community anticipated to be fully developed by 2035.

This master-planned development will include a library, post office, fire stations, public schools, walkable, well-planned town squares with stores, and nearly 5,000 acres of open space featuring 387 acres of parks and 166 miles of paths and trails.

However, this timeline is subject to change based on various factors, including economic conditions, regulatory approvals, and the resolution of any unforeseen challenges. The developers are committed to keeping the community informed of progress and any potential delays.

Silverwood community development represents a significant opportunity for growth in the Inland Empire, offering much-needed housing and amenities in a region poised for expansion. While the project faces challenges related to environmental impact, water supply, and infrastructure, the developers' comprehensive planning and community-focused approach provide a strong foundation for success. If all goes according to plan, Silverwood could become a model for sustainable development in Southern California, providing a vibrant and thriving community for future generations.
