THE GROWTH & SUCCESS OF READ B4K

This week the Club received a welcome visit by Read B4K Program Coordinator **Colleen Calderon** and **Jorge Escalante** who runs the Family Resource Center at the Victor



Elementary School District. Read B4K is an initiative started by the Rotary Club of Victorville at the Hook Community Center that is designed to promote literacy among young children. The program aims to ensure that children are reading at grade level by the time they enter kindergarten. This is typically achieved through various activities and resources, such as book distributions, reading sessions, and educational materials.

Children, as well as some parents, learn to read English by using the Funnix software to sound out words for both reading and writing as well as other reading tools to help them onto a path of success. Even 3-year old children have been able to learn to read by taking part in Read B4K.

Over the summer, seven parents took computers home to continue to work with their children so the learning



would be fresh in their minds heading into Kindergarten. According to Colleen, reading is the most important thing, as even math problems require reading.

Over at the VESD Family Resource Center, Read B4K is offered at multiple schools including Brentwood Elementary, Village STEAM School, Del Rey Elementary, Irwin Academy, Green Tree, Liberty, Mojave Vista and Lomitas. When Jorge began running the Read B4K program in 2019, they had 16 graduates. This school year, he is estimating a total of 75 graduates.

By focusing on early literacy, Read B4K helps set a strong foundation for future academic success. The Rotary Club of Victorville, through this program, contributes to building better educational opportunities for children in their community.
