THE (RE)BUILDING OF SCHOOLS

Victor Valley Union High School District Superintendent **Carl Coles** spoke to the Club this week on the importance of ballot Measures A and X this November, and how they will benefit the students of the District.

Measure A is a proposal to issue general obligation bonds to raise funds for the district. The funds from these bonds would be used specifically for capital improvements and facility upgrades across the district's schools. The key foci of the bond measure include:

Modernizing Classrooms: Upgrading outdated classrooms with new technology and furnishings to enhance learning environments.

Safety Improvements: Ensuring school facilities meet current safety and accessibility standards.

Infrastructure Repairs: Addressing critical repairs to aging buildings, such as roofs, plumbing, and electrical systems.

Energy Efficiency: Implementing energy-efficient upgrades to reduce operating costs and promote sustainability.

Measure X proposes a new parcel tax to provide ongoing funding for the district's educational needs. The revenue from this tax would be allocated to:

Educational Programs: Supporting and enhancing academic programs, extracurricular activities, and special education services.

Teacher Retention: Providing competitive salaries and benefits to attract and retain high-quality teachers.

Maintenance: Ensuring that school facilities are well-maintained and conducive to learning.

Unlike a bond measure, which provides a lump sum of funding for specific projects, a parcel tax generates a steady stream of revenue. This tax would be levied on property owners within the district, and the measure would specify the amount of the tax and the duration for which it would be collected.

The oldest school in the District is Victor Valley High School which was built in 1952, making it 72 years old! Some of the improvements needed are to modernize classrooms, painting of the whole campus, lighting of the sports fields, locker room renovations, replacement of the cafeteria roof, concrete repair, permanent bathrooms, pool modernization and an outdoor space for students. These needed improvements are just for one of the eleven schools in the District!

If you live in Victorville, Carl hopes you will vote a "Yes on these Measures on the November Ballot.
