

September 17, 2024 SAVING SMILES AND CHANGING LIVES

The Rotary District 5300 Rotaplast Project is a shining example of how dedicated volunteers and medical professionals can collaborate to change lives. **Sandy Christensen** from the Rotary Club of Pomona has gone on several of these missions and was on hand this week to share about her experience.

Cleft lip and palate are among the most common congenital conditions affecting newborns worldwide. These conditions

can lead to significant challenges, including difficulties in eating, speaking, and social integration. In many lowincome countries, access to surgical treatment is limited, leaving children vulnerable to social stigma and health complications. Recognizing this gap, Rotary District 5300 mobilized resources and expertise to make a tangible difference.

The mission of the Rotaplast Project is straightforward: to provide free reconstructive surgeries for children with cleft lip and palate. The project operates through partnerships with local medical teams and hospitals in

various countries, ensuring that the surgical procedures are conducted safely and effectively. Beyond surgery, the initiative also aims to raise awareness about the conditions and the importance of early intervention.

Rotary volunteers work with skilled surgeons, anesthesiologists, and nursing staff to organize surgical missions in countries where access to healthcare is limited. These missions often involve weeks of

planning and coordination to ensure that all medical needs are met.

Community Engagement: The project emphasizes the importance of community involvement. Local Rotary clubs help identify children in need and facilitate outreach programs to educate families about the available medical services.

Since its inception, the Rotary District 5300 Rotaplast Project has transformed the lives of thousands of children. Success stories abound, with many children regaining their ability to eat and speak normally, leading to improved self-esteem and better social integration. The project not only changes individual lives but also positively impacts families and communities, fostering a sense of hope and resilience.

The Rotary District 5300 Rotaplast Project exemplifies the power of humanitarian efforts and the impact that dedicated individuals can make in the lives of others.
