MOUNTAIN LION TRACKING & PHOTOGRAPHY

This week the Club heard from retired Fire Chief **Sid Hulquist** as he shared his year long journey to photograph a Mountain Lion in the Mojave Desert. Sid has been hiking in the desert for close to 40 years and although he claims to not be an expert, has a great passion for photography.

To shoot a Mountain Lion in its natural habitat takes a lot of learning and equipment. In fact, Sid spent the year learning the habits and patterns of these beautiful animals.

Sid has seven trail cameras that he uses for tracking. A trail camera shoots low quality videos day or night and is activated by a motion sensor. It is useful in determining wildlife patterns and habits.

Once he finds a location and determines the tracking path of the wildlife he is looking for, Sid will then move to a DSLR professional camera. The DSLR is used to photograph wildlife usually not seen, nocturnal or reclusive. The DSLR is also motion activated so when the animal comes across the camera's path, it takes a photo without anyone around

to disturb the animal in its natural habitat.

In June 2023 Sid and his son-inlaw went 7 miles into the Mountain Pass area north of Baker to catch these Mountain Lions, rarely seen in public. They eventually found deer remains and Mountain Lion scrapings. A scraping is akin to a cat who leaves his mark by pushing with its hind legs after using its litter box.

After three months using and moving the trail cameras around where they captured, ring-tail cats,

birds, deer and more, they finally found a wash area where three Mountain Lions Sid named "Big Boy", "Notched Ear", and "Pretty Lady", a female, would frequent.

On May 1, 2024, Sid finally got the photos he was wanting:





In the span of just over two weeks, they able to capture over 4,000 photos of this remote area of wildlife. Not only did the get the Mountain Lions, but also the rare red Tail hawks, Spotted Skunks and Foxes.
