The Greater High Desert Chamber of Commerce (GHDCC) was formed through the consolidation of four separate chambers: the Adelanto Chamber, Apple Valley Chamber, Hesperia Chamber, and Victor Valley Chamber. While the Barstow and Phelan Chambers opted out of participation, interest was expressed by the Lucerne Valley Chamber, showcasing the broad regional interest in creating a unified business organization.

The GHDCC offers a streamlined approach to membership and services for businesses across the High Desert. By combining resources, services, programs, and events, the chamber provides a single membership

fee structure. expanded networking opportunities, office multiple locations in Apple Valley, Hesperia, and Victorville. **Perhaps** most notably, the GHDCC delivers a unified leaislative voice that influences policy at local, county,

and state levels, advocating effectively for business interests.

The creation of the GHDCC required meticulous planning. A new corporation was established, complete with bylaws and a budget. Resolutions for the merger were approved by the boards of the individual chambers, with member endorsement secured through informational meetings.

The mission of the GHDCC is to support and sustain a thriving regional business community through informed leadership, legislative advocacy, educational opportunities, and high-level networking. This mission is underpinned by core values:

Business Enhancement

Connection and Promotion

Community Involvement

Legislative Advocacy

The chamber is particularly proud of its small business representation, with 62% of its membership comprising businesses with fewer than 10 employees.

Advocacy is a cornerstone of the GHDCC. The chamber hosts monthly Legislative Action Committee meetings and actively participates in the Inland Empire Chamber Alliance and California Chamber Legislative Briefings. By taking a stand on over 60 state bills, including opposing "job killer" bills and supporting "job creator" initiatives, the GHDCC has established itself as a vital player in shaping business-friendly policies.

In 2024, the chamber earned a spot in the prestigious California Chamber President's Circle, recognizing its outstanding contributions. Additionally, through its Political Action Committee (HD PAC), the GHDCC supported candidates, with 59% of endorsed individuals winning their elections.

The GHDCC has outlined ambitious goals for 2024-2025:

Speaker Series: Hosting 6–8 sessions on business topics to inspire and educate members.

Membership Growth: Aiming for a 25% annual increase in membership while reducing attrition.

Futurus Foundation Enhancements: Revamping bylaws and exploring new community initiatives.

Young Business League (YBL): Equipping High Desert youth with entrepreneurial and leadership skills while fostering connections with local business leaders.

Strategic Planning: Developing a 5-year strategic plan with clear milestones for long-term growth.

The GHDCC is committed to being a champion, catalyst, and convener for the business community. It fosters growth, brings together leaders and influencers, and advocates for a stronger, more unified regional economy.

The Greater High Desert Chamber of Commerce stands as a testament to the power of collaboration, ensuring the High Desert's business community thrives for years to come.
