#### MEET THE NEW FIRE CHIEF OF VICTORVILLE

Clemmer began with the Barstow Fire Department, where he gained valuable hands-on experience. He then moved on to Apple Valley Fire, where he served as Fire Chief for several years. Despite his success in Apple Valley, Chief Clemmer always had his sights set on Victorville. Since 2017, he had hoped to join the Victorville Fire Department, but he chose to remain in Apple Valley for five years, believing in the importance of stability and commitment to his role. Two years ago, Chief Clemmer

joined Victorville Fire as Battalion Chief and has now risen to Fire Chief, bringing his years of experience and vision for the future.

Under Chief Clemmer's leadership, the Victorville Fire Department is poised to improve service with a new apparatus that will enhance its operational capabilities. A major addition is a new ladder truck in a tiller truck style, which is longer than a traditional ladder truck but offers enhanced maneuverability. This vehicle can block all lanes on a freeway, providing an extra layer of safety for



first responders and other drivers. The new ladder truck also boasts double the storage space for essential firefighting equipment, making it a versatile and efficient asset to the department.

In addition to the ladder truck, the department will soon add three new paramedic squads that are transport-capable, bringing the total number of paramedic squads to five. This increase will ensure the department is better equipped to handle medical emergencies, offering fast

response times and comprehensive patient care.

Chief Clemmer is also focused on initiatives that aim to reduce the number of unnecessary 911 calls, helping to streamline resources and focus on the most urgent emergencies. One such initiative is the ECNS Program, a collaborative effort between the fire department and nurses who work within the dispatch center. This program allows nurses to provide advice and services to callers, helping to assess whether an emergency response is needed or if alternative care options can be explored. By addressing non-emergency situations more efficiently, this program helps keep the emergency response system available for true crises.

Another key initiative, Community Paramedicine, is designed to address the healthcare needs of residents without overwhelming emergency rooms. This program focuses on connecting people with the right services

Rather than transporting these individuals to an emergency room, paramedics will help them connect with appropriate mental health facilities, helping to clear space in local hospitals for patients who require urgent medical attention. The department will also partner with Victorville's Wellness Center to ensure that those in need of medical care receive it in the most appropriate setting.

As Chief Clemmer settles into his new role, he remains committed to his mission of making Victorville a safer and healthier place for all. With his experience, leadership, and passion for public service, the future of the Victorville Fire Department is bright.
